My thanks to the staff and volunteers of the library who worked so hard this month moving the non-fiction collection to the Mezzanine. The adult stack area looks so light and open now since the removal of the ceiling between the stack area and mezzanine. It's like a trip back in time imagining what the library looked like in the late 1800's when it was first built.

Starting next month, there'll be some changes to the way we make interlibrary loan requests for our patrons. Currently, all of our collection is listed with the Maine State Library through a computer server called Solar. The Solar server is being retired by them due to age. Since we will no longer be using this system, the state library has come up with a new way for us to make requests. Though you'll still make requests through us as you always have, there may be a little delay in getting things to you while we're making the swap over.

The library, along with the Margaret Chase Smith Library and the Maine Humanities Council is pleased to announce this falls book series "What America Reads: Myth-Making in Popular Fiction". This 5 month program begins on September 12th at 6pm at the Margaret Chase Smith Library. The public is welcome to participate. You can borrow your copy of each month's book at the library. The Summer Reading program is over and we had our most successful year so far. One hundred and twelve kids signed up for the reading challenge. These kids read, tracked, and logged 1,747 books—which is an amazing 12% more than last year! The library gave out 488 prizes over the course of the program, so, we definitely appreciate all the businesses and individuals who contributed: Gifford's Ice Cream, New Balance, Pizza Hut, McDonalds, Bangor Savings Bank, Variety Drug, Hannaford, Penny Hoyt. In addition to giving prizes for reading, we also offered 16 fun programs throughout the summer. It was a very fun, productive and amazing summer here in the children's library and we certainly hope the kids who participated not only enjoyed the experience but were able to keep their minds and bodies active and their reading skills up. I want to especially recognize the Friends of the Skowhegan Library for funding all of our Tuesday family programs that we had over the course of the summer. We were able to offer amazing programs thanks to their efforts.

As it does every year, summer comes quickly to an end and kids and families are gearing up to go back to school. So much of our children's educational success comes from parent involvement and a huge piece of that is reading. Read to your children. Let your children read to you. Give them access to different types of reading materials. Bring them to the library. Make reading a part of your family's routine and it will help set your child/children up for an easier school year
