The Skowhegan Library Renovation Committee is pleased to announce that a grant of \$255,000 has been received from the Next Generation Foundation. This money will be used towards construction of the elevator addition on the west side of our treasured 1889 library building. Work on this addition will begin after the completion of the basement level area that includes the Genealogy, Meeting and Computer Rooms and handicapped bathrooms.

Following is a statement from Next Generation Foundation: "The Next Generation Foundation was impressed with the many strengths of the Skowhegan Library. It is a stunning brick building that is being carefully and lovingly restored, and the elevator addition is a key piece that will unite all the different spaces while at the same time will make the building accessible and safe for all. We are thrilled to join others in supporting this important project."

It is impossible to adequately express our gratitude to Next Generation Foundation for its support. This generous grant represents a giant step towards the realization of the goals for the restoration and renovation of our library.

2014 has been a banner year for the Library Renovation Committee! Two major grants were received: USDA supplied a matching grant for the installation of the sprinkler system, and Next Generation Foundation granted funds toward the elevator addition as described above. Morton-Kelly Charitable Trust and Plum Creek Foundation also contributed during the year. Both of these organizations have supported us in the past and continue to be enthusiastic about our project.

Due to the whole-hearted effort of countless volunteers and the support of the entire community, our many fundraisers were very profitable. The Art Show, annual lawn sale, craft fair, raffles, Luck-of-the-Draw auction, bake sales, Mad Hatter's Tea Party and more were all very successful. Most recently, the Holiday Bazaar brought \$1,096.00, with an additional \$288.00 from the Longaberger Coffee Table Raffle.

Besides supporting these fundraisers, both individuals and businesses in our town have

contributed generously. The annual appeal letter alone has brought in \$18,283.69 during the last several months.
