CHILDREN'S ROOM

Every year at the end of January, the Youth Media Awards are announced--this is basically the Superbowl of children's and young adult literature. This year there were a lot of great winners announced. The Caldecott was *Undeafated* by Kwame Alexander and illustrated by Kadir Nelson, the Printz Award went to *Dig* by A.S. King, and the Newbery was awarded to the book *New Kid* by Jerry Craft. All three of these books along with numerous other award winners were ordered for our children's library and will be on the shelves shortly.

We have some exciting things going on in February. It is a short month, but it will be packed with fun activities at the library. During the week of February vacation, we will have something for the kids every day of the week (except Monday, because we will be closed for Presidents Day.) Tuesday, February 18th we will have our first STEAM Lab. This is a program for 5-12 years to encourage them to explore the areas of Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math. Participants will be making magnetic mazes and homemade lava lamps for our first session. STEAM Lab will be held again during April vacation, and then we plan on making it a bimonthly program starting next school year. On Wednesday, we will have our preschool storytime at 10:15. We will have stories, snacks, and a project for the families to enjoy. Thursday, we will be having BINGO for books at 3:00 and we will also be starting our Coding Club back for session 3. (If you are interested in signing up for this six week coding program, please call the library to register.) Friday, we have playgroup at 8:30 and then our High School Regression Session at 6:00 pm. High schoolers also need to register for this program.

We want to remind parents that the children's library is a warm sunny spot that can be used and enjoyed every weekday. You don't need to have a library card to come visit. We welcome families to share stories, play, explore, use the computers or iPads, or attend a program. Winter in Maine is cold, dark, and long but you don't need to keep the kids cooped up. Bring them in and enjoy our library!
