

Meet a Volunteer By Marcia B. Granville

Linda Betts and her family used to live in Massachusetts. When her husband had the opportunity for a good job in the area, they moved to Maine and were able to buy their first home. Linda soon became a regular patron of the Skowhegan Free Public Library. She was in the library so often that former Library Director, Melissa Gaspar, asked if she would like to become a volunteer.

Linda's answer was, "Yes." Now, anytime you are in the library, you are likely to see her working somewhere in the background; at the computer behind Francoise's desk, in the small office next to the genealogy room, or shelving returned books in the stacks. She calls herself a jack-of-all-trades since her job is so varied. She does whatever is needed. When a few older books begin to fall apart, she repairs them. She puts the plastic covers on new books, puts the spine labels on them, and enters them into the computer system. She works at cataloging, helping to bring the library system up to date. When Francoise has the day off or is on vacation, Linda often sits at the desk.

All those jobs are just a fraction of what Linda does, but she doesn't mind. When asked how she likes working at the library, she said, "I love it. I love the people I work with."

She thinks the library is moving in the right direction with new programs and talks by authors, and with the ITV video conferencing. She also approves of the renovations being made to the library. So far, most of the work has been done in the basement and outside of the building. There is much more to be done on the interior before an elevator can be installed. Linda says, "I can't wait until they're done."

Linda provides a valuable service to our library and our community. The many tasks that she and other volunteers perform could not be done without their help.

We appreciate all their good work.
