Friends to Buy Books, Equipment for Children's Room

At the Friends Executive Board meeting held on October 25, it was voted to contribute \$500 towards the purchase of nonfiction books for the children's collection. New speakers for the computers upstairs in the children's room will soon be purchased by the Friends and installed under the direction of Jim Foster. Once more, children will be able to have fun with the library's collection of computer games.

Maine State Databases Now Available

Patrons of the Library may now access a group of commercial Electronic Databases, thanks to a licensing agreement funded by the State of Maine in conjunction with the Maine State Library, the University of Maine System Libraries, and the Maine Technical College System Libraries.

The databases available include Academic Search Elite (containing items from over 1250 journals), MasterFILE Premier (1,830 periodicals), Primary Search and Middle Search Plus (70 children's and 100 middle-school level magazines), ERIC (educational journals), BIOSIS Previews and Zoological Record (on the life-sciences), Business Source Elite (business journals), MAS Ultra (general interest and current event magazines), Newspaper Source (143 US and foreign newspapers), Health Source Plus (health periodicals), etc.

Progressing on the Windows Renovation

The window renovation project is coming along nicely. All of the windows in the stacks room have been repaired and replaced. The three front windows in the children's library are back in place. As of Friday, November 3rd, the casings were being refinished. At the same time, the lower portions of the windows in the reading room had been taken to the shop to be worked on.

Mr. Tannenbaum of Canaan has been hired to repair the large stained glass window, this is a major job with many small pieces to be coaxed into alignment. It has been predicted that it may take as much as four months to complete the job. In the meantime, please bear with us. Your library will be better than ever when the work is complete.
