CHILDREN'S ROOM

The month of July is the busiest month for the children's library. We have two major events up here during this time: the summer reading program and the visit from our friend and benefactor, Kristine Rinaldi. Kristine, who works part time for Scholastic, travels to Skowhegan every summer from her home in Spring, Texas. All year long, she scarfs up every good deal she can, and this year, was able to bring us over 600 books! These books will be used for both our collection and also as giveaways for programs such as the Holiday Stroll. We are also super excited when we see her roll in and start to pull out box after box of beautiful, new books! This librarian (and many, many young readers!) appreciates her very generous donations.

If you have been at the library on a Wednesday morning, you know that our Summer Reading Program is going full throttle. All the community heroes we have coming in as guest readers are attracting big crowds of eager kids. This past month, we had Dr. Lambke, Officer Daigneault, Warden Bubier, Town Manager, Christine Almand, and Firefighter Rick. The kids are listening to stories and also learning about some pretty heroic professions.

We still have a couple of community heroes left on the schedule, if you are interested. Everett Flannery who is an EMT will be coming in to read and we will wrap up our story time guest readers with Dr. Gibson who is a veterinarian.

Also this month, we have finally finished the transition and re-organization of the nonfiction section. We have decided to move away from the Dewey decimal system and instead have organized books within groups based on subject headings. These subjects are color-coded and labeled for easier browsing by the patron. Want a book on the ocean? That would be found in the green section which is "Science and Nature." How about a book on presidents? Those would be found in the blue section which is "Social"

Studies." Kids seem to be enjoying the new system and are finding books more easily by themselves. There will always be a librarian on hand to help patrons search for things, but we think this new organizational system should give even the youngest of patrons a nice, clear picture of where books might be housed.
