

BOOK REVIEW

The 5,000 Year Leap: A Miracle that Changed the World by W. Cleon Skousen

The 5,000 Year Leap is a concise, easy to understand overview of the 28 ideas which the founding fathers believed were the secret to success for America. It is inspirational, practical and as relevant to our country today as when these ideas were used as the basis for the Constitution of the United States and the Declaration of Independence. The book is organized so that a person could get the main ideas by a guick perusal of the chapter headings or read the chapters in depth. The Founding Fathers debated at length universal truths that they believed needed to be the foundation for a sound and moral government. They did this, volunteering their time and at their own expense, to distill the deepest understanding of human nature and the role of government. Men like John Adams, James Madison, and George Washington believed these 28 ideas needed to be understood and practiced in order to ensure peace, prosperity and freedom for America. W. Cleon Skousen captures the essence and spirit of the Founding Fathers foresight and intentions for the future of America.

Although I have taken many history classes, I found this book to be more valuable and interesting than anything I read in school. I highly recommend it as an informative and inspirational good read.
