Over the years the library has sponsored Community Events such as The Community Read in 2007. We chose the book, Once Upon a Town for its inspirational story of what a town was able to accomplish by working together. The following year, we had a Community Writing Program. We collected original poems and short essays on nature by people of all ages and "published" them in a book called, Enjoying Nature: Sharing our stories. If you haven't read it yet, you can check it out at the library.

Last year was the Community Art and Heritage Celebration. Barry Norling created the giant aluminum shoe and Milton Christianson painted historic icons of Skowhegan on the shoe. The shoe combined history and art in an interesting way to create a lasting tribute to the shoe industry and other important historical events. The shoe also promotes healthy activities such as walking and hiking.

This year, the library is promoting a Community Music event focusing on two very prominent Skowhegan residents: Elise Fellows White and Louise Coburn. Elise Fellows White was born in the early 1870's and at a young age showed musical talent. She received an excellent training at the New England Conservatory in Boston and in Vienna, Austria. At about 18 years of age she gave two concerts in Vienna and then embarked on an extensive tour of the United States. In 1897-8 she took a special course at Colby College and won first prize for one of her compositions. During her lifetime, she was a member of the

Daughters of the American Revolution, the Maine Writers Research Club, the Skowhegan Historical Society, The Skowhegan Free Public Library Board of Directors and many other organizations.

Louise Coburn, was the niece of Abner Coburn, and author/editor of Skowhegan on the Kennebec, the most detailed history of Skowhegan ever written. She was also a poet.

On Wednesday, May 12th the Friends are sponsoring a program that will allow us to hear a song composed by Elise Fellows White with words written by Louis Coburn. This is a unique and historical event not to be missed. The song to be performed is "A Song to Maine" which was later adopted as the state song of the Daughters of the American Revolution. We will also be celebrating Francoise's 30th anniversary at the library. This program is free and open to the community. Further details inside.

The Secrets of Simplicity: Learn to live better with Less by Mary Carlomangno is a treasure of simple wisdom that gently guides the reader on a journey of self discovery and rediscovery.
