The Every Hero Has a Story summer reading program is gearing up and sign-ups will begin on June 8th. We are inviting all kids ages 2 to 12 to participate. It's an 8 week long program that begins on June 23rd and is aimed at keeping kids engaged in reading and learning all summer long. Registering your kids is as simple as coming in to the library to fill out a sign-up sheet. (The first 100 kids get a free bag with goodies!) The kids who sign up will keep track of their weekly reading all eight weeks, and for each week they fulfill their goal, they get a prize. It's that easy. Last year, our participants read 1,481 books. Let's see if we can beat that this year!

In addition to reading for prizes, we also offer weekly storytimes and weekly family programs. Our summer storytimes will be all about everyday heroes. We will have guest readers like fire fighters, doctors, EMTs, and police officers. These storytimes will take place every Wednesday at 10:00. Our family programs are a lot of fun activities that are open and free to all. Some of the programs are here at the library and others are out and about in the community. All of these programs are on Tuesdays and the descriptions of them can be found on our website and on our Facebook page. Schedules of programs will be going out to Skowhegan kids in grades K-5 within the next couple of weeks or you can pick one up at the library when you register your child/children.

Because we have so much going on during the summer in conjunction with our summer reading program, we want to remind you that our Toddler Time, Family Story Hour, and Tween the Pages Book Club ended in May. These programs will pick back up in the fall.
