The Maine School and Library Network, who provide our internet service, has just installed gigabit speed in the library. This fiber cable allows much faster downloads of programs, and faster speeds for music and videos. We're one of the first entities in central Maine to receive this update.

Our Holiday Bazaar was a great success. We made over \$900 dollars toward the library renovations. And speaking of the library renovations, when you see Pat Dickey around town, please take a minute to thank her for all of her hard work in fundraising for the library
