CHILDREN'S ROOM

The month of July is the busiest month for the children's library. We have two major events up here during this time: the summer reading program and the visit from our friend and benefactor, Kristine Rinaldi. Kristine, who works part time for Scholastic, travels to Skowhegan every summer from her home in Spring, Texas. All year long, she scarfs up every good deal she can, and this year, was able to bring us over 600 books! These books will be used for both our collection and also as giveaways for programs such as the Holiday Stroll. We are also super excited when we see her roll in and start to pull out box after box of beautiful, new books! This librarian (and many, many young readers!) appreciates her very generous donations.

The Summer Reading Program is going full throttle. We have had a combined attendance of 559 kids at all of our programming this month. That is just simply amazing! Our latest program—where over 200 people came out—was a visit from Maine children's author and illustrator, Chris Van Dusen. Thanks to collaboration with the Canaan Public Library, The Children's Book Cellar, and Lake George we were able to get him out to our area for a reading and book signing. He was simply amazing to listen to and despite the heat he sat and signed books and had photos taken for nearly two hours.

Also this past month we have visited the LC Bates Museum, learned how to be nutrition detectives with Ms. Jenn, and got up close and personal with some different animals here at the library. I was excited to see them all...until he pulled out the big snake!

We have three programs left in our Summer Reading Program: Yoga for Kids with Gabrielle, Rocket Races with the Two Crazy Women, and then our Closing Ceremonies. The Yoga program and the Rocket Races program are both programs that you need to register for, so please call the library if you want your kids to attend. As always these are free and open to the public.

So far we have given out over 250 prizes to the kids that have met their weekly reading goals and we still have three weeks left to go! Our prize buckets are getting a little low and we could use some new goodies to put in them. Our prizes (both the little incentives and the local certificates) are all done by donations through our community. We appreciate each and every business, family, or individual who has given to this cause. Help us finish strong!

In September we will be starting (or restarting) our school year programming. Family Story Hour, Tween the Pages, Teen Regression Sessions, and Lego Club will be regular occurring programs. More information about these programs can be found on our website and our Facebook page.
